


Attenborough Class Homework- Term 3- Castles

Do you notice any patterns?	Can you create your own version of a traditional tale? E.g. Little Red Riding Hood Remember to change certain key points or characters.	Visit a castle- tell me about your visit. Or View a Castle's website. List 5 things that you learnt about it. What makes it a good castle?
Can you remember the names of each coin/note? Can you show them in order? (pictures/rubbings/labels)	Can you show me all of the number bonds to 10? e.g. $0 + 10 = 10$ $1 + 9 \dots$ etc.	Use your measuring skills to measure different items around your house. Record their lengths using cm/m.	Analyse the different seasons. Can you list their features (day length, weather, temperature, clothing, plants etc.)	Create a castle map. Label the important features. You might also like to include a key for your map.	(Ask Miss Sexton for a copy of your writing) Here is your writing when you started Attenborough Class.
