



## Kinney Class Homework Term 3

This can be presented using drawings, on the computer or hand written.</p>	<p>Children started work as young as 5 years old in the Victorian times and would often work as chimney sweeps, in factories or in coal mines. Be as creative as you can!</p>	<p>The railway has helped Ashford become a popular place. Do you agree? Justify your reasons.</p>
<p>We are continuing Year 3 spellings.</p> <p>Please practice weekly spellings and challenge yourself by putting them into sentences or paragraphs.</p> <p>These will be tested every Friday.</p>	<p>Draw your favourite character from the book you are reading. You could keep adding to your picture to make a picture of a group of characters from different stories.</p>	<p>The average wage in the 1850s was about 15 shillings (75p) a week. Many children got just 5 shillings (25p) a week, or less.</p> <p>How much did a child earn in 3 weeks? 5 weeks? 8weeks?</p> <p>How much did an adult earn in 4 weeks? 7 weeks? 9 weeks?</p>	<p>Watch this amazing video about magnets and forces. Tell me what you think about it.</p> <p>Do you think it would have taken a long time to set up? Why? Did you enjoy the video?
