


Nightingale Class Homework- Term 6 - Shiver Me Timbers!

Think about what materials you would use to make sure it doesn't sink or collapse in the water! We will test it at school! (This homework could go over 2 weeks.)</p>	<p>Create or design a pirate artefact of your choice. (This homework could go over 2 weeks.)</p>	<p>Evaluate your time in Nightingale Class. What have you enjoyed the most and why? What have you got better at? What are your goals for Year 3? Present as you wish.</p>
<p>If you know your 2, 5 and 10 times tables, challenge yourself to learn another times table of your choice. Make sure that you know the facts in any order. Present as you wish.</p>	<p>What would a pirate eat for lunch? Use your imagination to design a creative lunch, fit for a pirate. Record your ideas in a menu, as a drawing or actually make the lunch.</p>	<p>Pretend that you are a pirate, who has been at sea for several months. Write a diary describing life on board the ship. Alternatively, you may wish to film your diary, which we could watch in class.</p>	<p>Design a pirate's outfit, thinking about suitable materials to withstand the wet and windy conditions out at sea. Draw and label your design, explaining why you chose each of the materials.</p>		<p>Evaluate the topics we have carried out in Nightingale Class. Which has been your most and least favourite? Why? Present as you wish.</p>
