

<p>Times tables: Your child will know which times tables they are currently working on. These should be practised at home as often as possible. <i>Tablesmaster</i> is a great resource to make it more fun!</p>	<p>Can you find out the measurements of these items? - Length of a Viking longboat - Width of a shield. - Length of a spear Can you convert them into millimetres, centimetres and meters?</p>	<p>Can you write a secret message to me or to a friend using the Viking Alphabet?</p> 	<p>Imagine that a longboat has been found. Write a newspaper report about the discovery – this can be handwritten or created on the computer.</p> <p>Remember to use the 5 Ws: What? Where? When? Who? Why?</p>	<p>Build or draw a Viking settlement and bring it into school. Be as creative as you like.</p>	<p>Research and write a non-chronological report booklet or poster about Viking weapons.</p>
<p>Sentence building: Develop your sentence building skills on http://www.sentenceplay.co.uk/ You can evidence this by a note in your homework book from a parent or a print out of your activity.</p>	<p>Research the food that was eaten during the rule of the Vikings. See: http://www.primaryhomeworkhelp.co.uk/viking/food.html Compare their diet to ours. Who do you think was healthier and why?</p>	<p>Make your own Viking recipe. Name the food, draw a picture, write the ingredients and instructions.</p>	<p>Make a cartoon strip of a Viking raid.</p>	<p>Create a set of 10 top trump cards about famous Viking gods - be prepared to play!</p>	<p>Make a wanted poster for a naughty Viking warrior. The poster should explain why the warrior is wanted, what have they done? It should include a reward.</p>
<p>Spelling Shed: these spellings will change weekly and we are hoping that Ahlberg class will reach the top of the school league table! ☺</p>	<p>Make a list of 8 countries which the Vikings invaded or went to.</p>	<p>Write a profile about a Viking god. This should include a picture, name, strengths and weaknesses, family and any other interesting information.</p>	<p>Design a new weapon explaining the reason for the design and also explain what materials you would make it from and why.</p>	<p>Find out about jewellery during Viking rule. Create or draw your own piece of jewellery.</p>	<p>End of topic: create a quiz about the Vikings for a friend to solve or create a wordsearch!</p>
