Here are some things you could do to help you with your weekly spellings:

- Write the words out in different ways to help you remember them.
 - Write the words in sentences.
 - Write each word out three times.
 - Write the words only in capital letters.
- Segment the word into phonemes (sounds) using sound buttons.
 - Use one colour for consonants, one colour for vowels.
 - Write the words in fancy writing or using bubble letters.
- Use your imagination and write in as many ways as you can think of.
 - Find words within words.
- Think of ways to help you remember the spelling of particular words e.g. little rhymes.
 - Think of some other words that use the same rule.

Once you have learnt how to spell individual words or learnt particular spelling patterns or rules, your aim is to use and apply your spelling knowledge within your independent writing.
