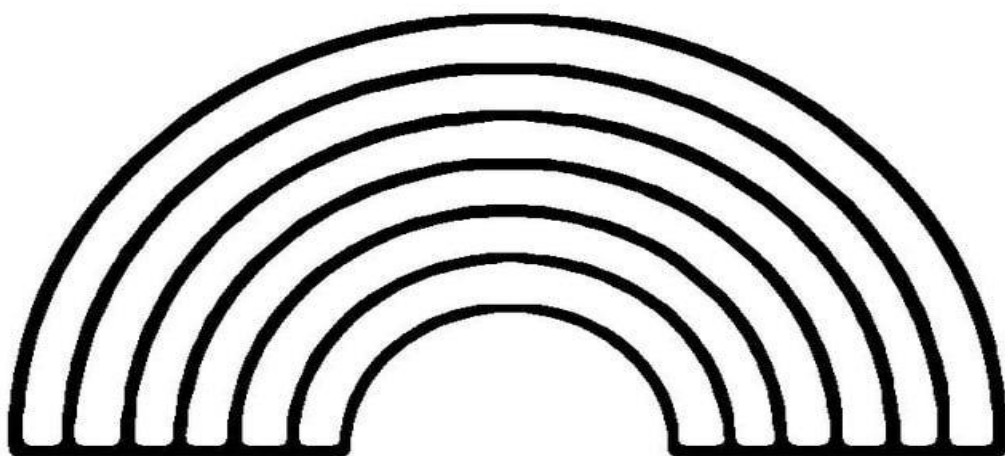


# Parrot Class Homework - Term 1- Marvellous Mersham, Marvellous Me!

Can you <b>write</b> all or some of your numbers to 20 in symbols and words? Write in pencil or present your work in a colourful way of your choice.	Find a book set in a home and read it with an adult. Talk about the book and then write a sentence to <b>explain</b> your favourite part. You could also draw a picture.	<b>Classify</b> the types of jobs that people in Mersham do.  Draw or paint the job that you would like to do the most. Can you explain why?	<b>Investigate</b> how many people work at Mersham Primary School. Write a list and count the total.  (Remember to use capital letters for names.)	<b>Create</b> your own information sheet about Mersham Village or Mersham Primary School.	Write a short letter to a local councillor to <b>recommend</b> ways to make Mersham better, or write to Mrs Chalkley about any ideas that you have which would improve our school.
Buy something in Mersham Stores or another shop. <b>Write</b> down what it was and how much it cost. Were you given any change? How much?	How has Mersham Village changed over time? <b>Talk to</b> a family member or friend and find out what they know about how Mersham has changed. Present what you find out as you choose.	<b>Complete</b> a drawing showing the four main compass points. Can you write your own special rhyme to help you remember the order?	Visit one of the parks in Mersham. If you could re-design it, what different things would you include? You could <b>explain</b> your ideas by writing about them, drawing and labelling the features you design, or by drawing a plan of your ideal park.	<b>Construct</b> a model of a feature of Mersham. For example, a building such as the church or shop, or a piece of play equipment from the park.	<b>Evaluate</b> your first term in Parrot Class. What have you enjoyed the most? What have you improved at already and what would you like to get better at in the future? (Carry out in final week if chosen.)



## Term 1 Homework

- Children should complete one homework task each week (homework is handed in on a Tuesday, marked and then books return home on a Thursday).
- Over the term one task from each colour of the rainbow should be completed (in any order).
- There is a choice of two activities for each colour but only one needs to be completed.
- Please colour the correct section on the rainbow to show the chosen activity. By the end of the term, the rainbow will be complete!
- Each week, in your homework book, please write the date and colour a small circle to show your activity choice.
